The Integrated Building Energy Efficiency topical lunch gathered 30 participants, about 50% faculty/researchers, 40% facilities, and 10% cooperative extension. The main question was whether there was value in having disparate groups talk to each other more. The resounding answer was "Yes". It was useful to find out who else worked on building energy efficiency at Cornell. Several potential collaborations were discussed.

One highlight was the potential for using campus data more fully. A participant from facilities services said that Cornell has rolled out advanced sensing technology, but that this has created more data than can be analyzed by hand. One potential partnership is using campus buildings as "living" laboratories. Facilities personnel get the benefit of external data analysis. Researchers get the benefit of real world data. Collaborations like this may help differentiate Cornell from other schools, enabling us to be more competitive with grants.

We also sent out a survey of the participants, asking them for feedback and for one collaboration idea that came out of the discussion. Here are just a few highlights (paraphrased):

- Francis Vanek -- In the new budget model units will be required to pay for utilities (electricity, steam, chilled water), it makes sense to make available a funding stream to help them finance investments in efficiency that would reduce ongoing utility costs.
- Erin Moore -- Develop metrics and research based on building occupants attitudes and well being based on campus sustainability and their involvement. Also: a very useful campus link: Real Time Energy Data Portal: http://portal.emcs.cornell.edu/
- Alan Zehnder -- The main point I got out of the discussion was that habit and human behavior are hard to change... [E]fforts on the engineering side need to link to efforts on the social science & communications side of the house.

When asked if we should do this lunch again nearly everyone expressed strong support to do another Topical Lunch in Fall 2013.
