Topical Lunch Summary:

Setting Priorities for Climate Change Research, Teaching, and Outreach at Cornell Thursday, November 19 from 12:00 – 1:00 pm in 300 Rice Hall Report submitted: 2/24/16

Discussion Focus: Faculty interest, new faculty hires, and research, teaching, and outreach activities at Cornell relevant to climate change have expanded greatly in the past 10 years. The goal of this lunch was to identify where we are now in terms of strengths and weaknesses, help set priorities for research and new initiatives to maximize our collective impact on climate change solutions and expand collaboration across the disciplines, identify areas where support from university administration is needed, and discuss funding opportunities. This will provide guidance to the Atkinson Center Climate Change Consortium, comprised of faculty from the climate sciences, engineering, ecology, agriculture, social sciences, and humanities. The Consortium was first formed in 2008 and has worked to (1) advise ACSF and the university at large on research priorities and campus strengths and needs, (2) advise, facilitate or implement new initiatives (e.g., faculty hires, new courses, the new climate change minor), and (3) develop mechanisms for exchange of information across campus (e.g., seminars and symposia) and beyond (e.g., the www.climatechange.cornell.edu website).

Initial follow-up

- Wolfe has been invited to join a new university-level "Climate Change Action Advisory Committee" with direct connection to university leadership and Joel Molina (University Communications). He has provided input to that committee regarding ACSF Climate Consortium activities of the past, and research and other priorities identified by the Consortium and discussions from this Topical Lunch. A joint meeting with the ACSF Climate Change Consortium has been suggested but not set up yet. One initial activity of this new committee is providing advice on a climate change (and sustainability) web presence on Cornell home page. This will hopefully be linked or related to the current http://climatechange.cornell.edu website
- Toby Ault (climate scientist, EAS), along with Wolfe and Allison Chatrchyan (CICCA) have initiated a series of campus workshops focused on "climate change and food security", with over 40 faculty involved in weekly meetings to discuss priorities, funding opportunities, etc..
